UNDERAGE DRINKING IN NORTH CAROLINA

Parents face severe penalties

and punishments for allowing or facilitating underage drinking:

- One-year driver license revocation
- Fines and court costs in excess of \$500
- Minimum of 25 hours of community service and possible jail time
- All adults can be held Criminally AND civilly liable for hosting or allowing ANY underage drinking

District attorneys statewide have expressed concern and intend to uphold the law and vigorously prosecute offenders who supply alcoholic beverages to people under 21 years old.

KNOW THE LAW!

Under 21 it is ILLEGAL to:

- purchase alcoholic beverages
- **POSSESS** alcoholic beverages
- **consume** alcoholic beverages
 - use fake ID to attempt to buy alcoholic beverages
 - **drive** after drinking

ANY AMOUNT

of alcoholic beverages

It is ILLEGAL for ANYONE to:

• give alcoholic beverages to anyone under the age of 21

there are NO EXCEPTIONS!

POTENTIAL PENALTIES

for using a fake ID:

- minimum punishment: class one misdemeanor
- may be charged with a felony
- one year driver license **revocation**
- **no** limited driving privilege
- fines and court costs over \$200 for first offense, and over \$500 for second
- community service and possible jail time

Driving after consuming ANY amount of alcoholic beverage:

Tolerance

- immediate revocation of license for 30 days when charged
- One year revocation of license after conviction
- fines and court costs over \$200 for first offense, and over \$500 for second
